

Marco Island Museum

Congratulations to the Marco Island Historical Society which has raised over \$4 million so far and has begun building the Museum which they hope will house the "Key Marco Cat" among other historic artifacts and documents. The



Calusa "panther lion god" carving is currently stored by the Smithsonian and can not be moved until a suitable building with a controlled environment is available.

The new museum is located on Heathwood Drive (next to the library) and scheduled to be dedicated in early 2010. The complex will be composed of three buildings connected by galleries and walkways, landscaped with a lagoon, and planted with Florida natives. When finished, it will be part of the Collier County Museums system.

However, the fundraising continues. The MIHS are asking for donations of \$1,000 which can be paid over 4 years (\$250 now and each year through 2012). In return, the donor's name will be listed on the Founders' Circle wall inside the Museum. The deadline for this campaign is **Friday, May 15,** which also happens to be the birthday of Capital Campaign co-chair Betsy Perdichizzi.
