PRESIDENT'S REPORT, 2013

Our directors and officers (listed on the back page) serve a 3-year term. The next election will be in February 2015. The Board will appoint someone to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Jane Rackley.

Our largest expense was a donation to restore some of the Julian Dimock photos for publication (see article inside).

Our largest source of income was the Everglades Homes Tour in March with over 300 people attending, some of whom were repeats from previous tours.

Our Movie Nights were popular with residents and visitors locally and from Marco Island or Naples. We were given a popcorn machine which makes serving everyone much easier. Our thanks to Everglades Community Church for use of the Jinkins Fellowship Hall.

We held our Annual Meeting on February 25 with a presentation about Oral History by Elaine Reed, Executive Director of the Naples Historical Society, and we had a Nostalgia Night on November 22 to recall the death of President John F. Kennedy.

We have taken fiscal responsibility for the annual Blessing of the Stone Crab Fleet at the end of September. Our director Tod Dahlke thought up the idea over five years ago and is the main organizer.

We have started 2014 with several successful events and projects. We look forward to the rest of the year and thank you for your support!

Julian Dimock and his father A.W. travelled around the Everglades between 1904 and 1910 taking photographs on glass plates of people and nature in the untamed wilderness.


