

## **BULA MISSION UPDATE**

We have met with the Copeland Civic Association who agree that the site should become a community center in memory of Ms Frances Hodge (the owner who died at almost



101 years old in 2006). After consulting with several construction firms, the structure was deemed too decrepit to save without exorbitant expenditure. We expect that the building will be demolished in January and the site will be handed over to the Civic Association. The babies' graves that are thought to exist at the side of the building will, of course, be protected and a memorial plaque will be erected.




# EVERGLADES HOMES TOUR
