CHURCH RENOVATION

Everglades Community Church is being restored back to its original look. Pastor Bob Wallace reports that the layers of siding have been stripped off, the basic wooden structure is sound, and that shatter-proof windows are being installed. The decorative stained-glass will be put behind the protective outer windows.

The Church was completed in 1940 on land donated by the Collier Corporation. Stan Kanning, Chairman of the Board of Governors, has sent in an application for listing on the National Register of Historic Places and also for a State Historical Marker.

BANK BUILDING FOR SALE

Bank of the Everglades, completed in 1927 and used as a bank until 1962, is for sale. The owners had operated it as a Bed & Breakfast and then rented it out but they have reluctantly decided to sell.

The building was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1999 and is also designated by the City as an historic property. For more info
