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SUNSET LODGE CEMETERY

The shell-mound property on the west side of the Barron River was farmed after the Civil War by the Weeks brothers and from 1883 by the Brown family. After the 1926 hurricane, it was purchased by Barron Collier and later became Sunset Lodge with a little bar on the dock called the "Hook, Line, and Sinker".

Outward Bound of North Carolina bought the property in 1987 as a base camp for their backcountry expeditions.

The cemetery on the adjacent land, which is now owned by the State, contains the Brown family burial plot. The gravestones still visible are:

John Joseph Brown
March 10, 1892
Norman W. Brown
October 28, 1899 to August 21, 1912
Judith Gaile Brown
April 10, 1941 to April 4, 1943
Maggie S. Wintle, Our Sister
April 13, 1879 to September 24, 1897

SAVE THE HISTORIC EVERGLADES BANK BUILDING

Our latest campaign is to make sure that this 1927 building is kept for posterity. The Bank operated here until 1962 when it moved to Immokalee. The structure was then used over the years as a boarding house, offices for the *Everglades Echo* newspaper, and bed & breakfast.

The Bank Building was listed in 1999 on the National Register



The building is now for sale. Although the inside has been partially stripped, the old vault remains. The foundations are thought to be sound and an inspection will be made of the roof.
