Author Rick Magers brings the past alive in Ghosts of Chokoloskee when Ted Smallwood, Edgar Watson, Dan House, G.C. McKinney, and others float into the famous store over 100 years after the fabled killing of Mr. Watson.

The fictional journalist who narrates the story also describes present-day people and places in our area – the McMillin family in Chokoloskee, Orlo Hilton at Triad Seafood in Everglades City. He even strays as far as Joanie's Blue Crab in Ochopee while he waits for night and the ghostly appearances.

This is an interesting read with lots of local color, history, and humor. 
