### **MONROE STATION**

Monroe Station, on US-41 at the end of the Loop Road, was built in 1928 after the Tamiami Trail was constructed. It was one of six way-side stops between the Dade County border and East Naples that sold gas and snacks. A patrolman on a motorbike was based at each one and drove around to make sure cars were not stranded.

Eventually. Monroe Station became a restaurant rented from the Collier Corporation. It was a popular spot for hunters in the adjacent glades and for tourists traveling along the Trail.

The building is now owned by Big Cypress National Preserve who have plans to restore it. It was listed in 2000 on the National Register of Historic Places, which is administered by the National Park Service.

Our speaker on Friday, December 9, is Bob DeGross, Chief of Interpretation and Public Affairs for the Preserve, who has studied the history of Monroe Station. His presentation delves into the history of the Trail as well as the building itself.

Join us at 5:00 p.m. in the Everglades Community Church Fellowship Hall for light refreshments before Bob starts his talk at 5:30 p.m. Everyone is welcome to this free event.

If you have memories of stopping at the station, we will have a nostalgia session after the formal presentation. For info, phone Marya at 695-2905.
