News from the Historical Library



LOST ROAD?

There will be a public hearing about the road leading to the Smallwood Store in Chokoloskee on Tuesday, December 10,



during the Board of County Commissioners' meeting in Naples to discuss whether the County should "vacate" Mamie Street and turn it over to the developers.

At a meeting on October 1, Commissioner Nance said he was not aware of the public interest in the road and at another meeting at Parkway Village on October 10 with the County Attorney, the attendees heard that it was only those with "direct interest" (ie, neighbors on the road) who were important.

Local area residents remember using the road to get their mail when the Smallwood Store was also the Post Office and are obviously upset that the right of way will be closed.
